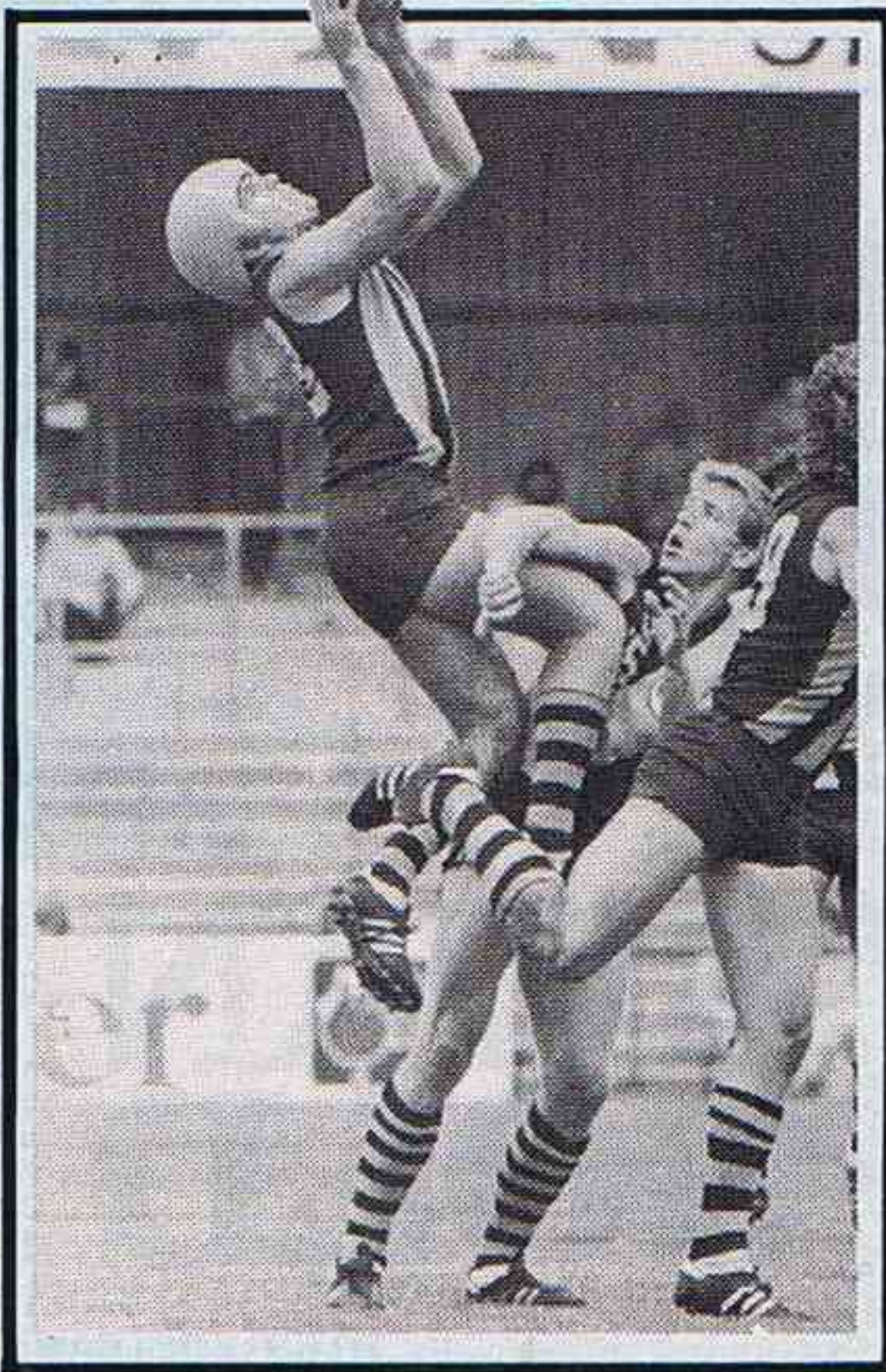




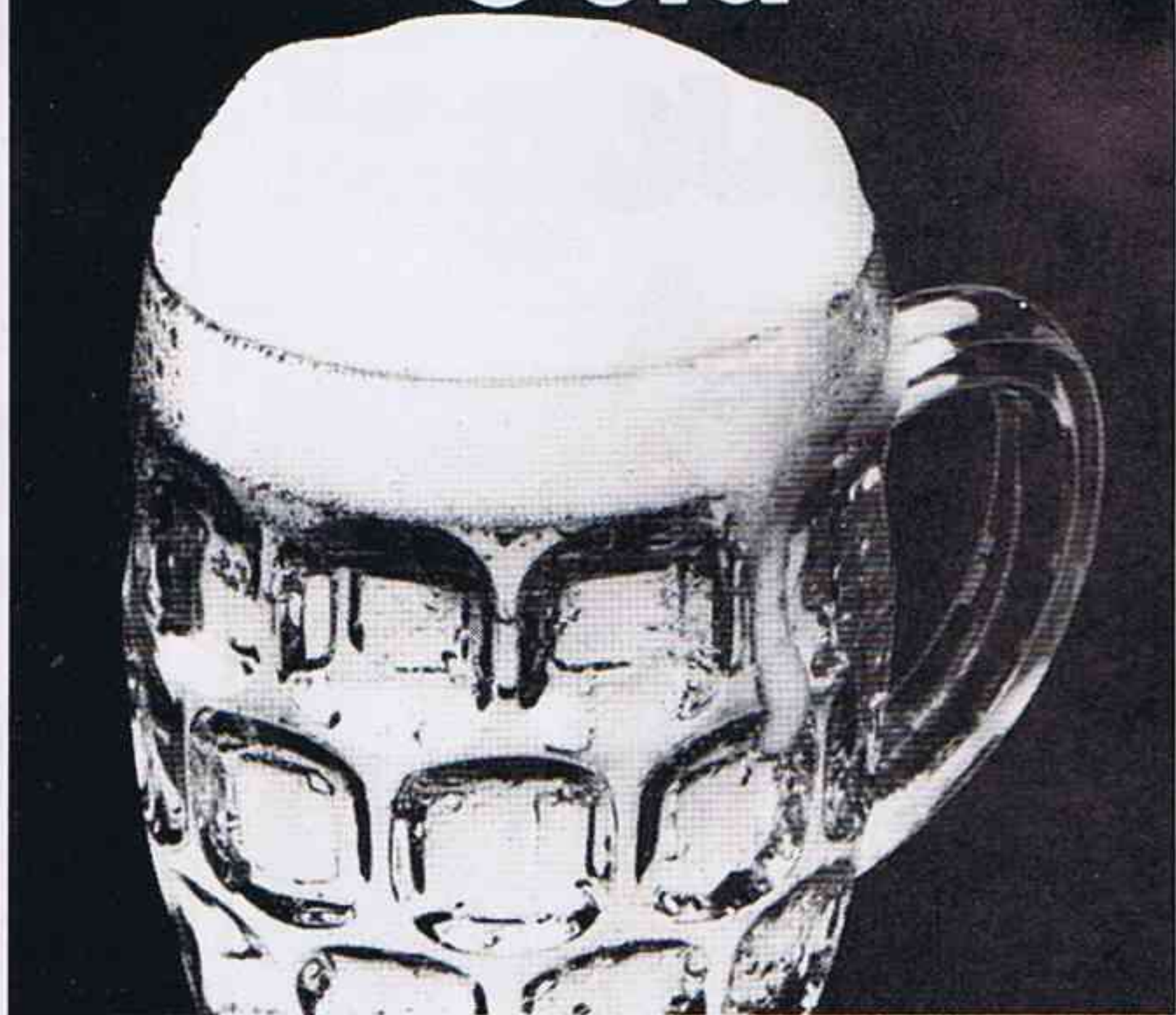

Great build-up to another season

FOOTBALL is well and truly back with us again . . . and the 1982 season has opened with a flourish seldom seen before in Western Australia.

In just a two-week space leading up to today's official opening of the WAFL season we have seen:

*Two top-class victories in the elimination rounds of the \$470,000 Escort Cup series, with Swan Districts trouncing Glenelg and South Fremantle downing Norwood.

*Two high-quality Victorian teams in Carlton and Essendon coming to Perth for a double-header match at Perth Oval. Carlton won the battle of the premiers by beating Claremont in an excellent game and East Perth impressed with a classy victory over Essendon.

*And then last weekend we saw the highly successful introduction of the Red Rooster round-robin carnival, with \$30,000 in prize money being carved up by the eight league clubs in what was a real football feast — and West Perth emerging with the biggest slice of the cake.

So now we are ready for the opening bounce in the 1982 season; a season that sees Claremont open up as the premiership titleholders, a crown that they have only worn four times in their long history.

Graham Moss is the man at the helm, the coach that other coaches will try to outfox and Claremont are the team that other teams will strive just that little bit harder to beat, so they can claim that they have downed the reigning champions.

We see three new coaches on the scene — Dennis Cometti, ABC radio and television commentator and critic, returns to West Perth, where he first played senior football; Ron Alexander, former East Perth and then Fitzroy captain and champion ruckman, arrives back in the West to take the field as East Fremantle's playing coach and Ian Miller, Sandover and Simpson Medallist and football veteran, returns to his original club, Perth.

Those three men take over the clubs that finished sixth, seventh and eighth on last year's premiership table (respectively) and they are all, naturally enough, seeking

to improve their club's position.

At the top of the table, Claremont have lost their superstar rovers, Jim and Phil Krakouer; South Fremantle have lost Maurice Rioli and Swan Districts have seen a major exodus of senior players.

In the middle of last year's field we have East Perth losing several key players but looking healthy with plenty of young talent and Subiaco, who seem destined to lose their most skilful player in Gary Buckenara, determined to continue the improvement that they showed at the end of the 1981 season.

All in all, it promises to be a great season. Selecting top four teams, premiership teams, Sandover Medal winners . . . or just weekly victors will be very hard.

UNVEILING A NEW STAR

EVERY year we talk of the star footballers who have moved over to the VFL. We talk about the talent drain and the player exodus.

But what we often overlook is that WA has the capacity to develop plenty of star footballers. After all, where do all these VFL stars come from?

This year the Football Budget will look at the players of today who will be the stars of tomorrow. . . . and how they made their way into the top bracket of league footballers.

LANKY Laurie Keene was quite overawed when he was invited to a special function at Subiaco Oval late last year.

The big Subiaco forward was quite used to going to Subiaco's social club for functions. . . but this was different. He was conspicuous because of his youth and inexperience.

As it turned out, Keene was about to be honoured with the Footballer-of-the-Future award bestowed by the Football Media Guild of WA; an award that saw him selected as the best young player in the competition judged on the votes of the football media. . . . the radio, television and newspaper men who cover the game each week.

The Football Media Guild, in only its second year, had nominated Keene, a 21-year-old from Innaloo, in Subiaco's district, as the player with the most potential among the newcomers to football in the 1981 season.

A 9.5 performance against East Perth on July 5 last year had stamped him as a player with enormous potential. . . and though he had his ups and downs after that, his potential was always there.

Keene, a student, played 12 games for Subiaco last season and already in the practice matches this year he has shown that he intends to become a permanent member of the Lions league side.

He is tall and agile, possessing a strong pair of hands and the height necessary to figure in the big-man duels. Keene was initially destined for a role in the ruck department, but his skill at full-forward gives him a double chance of becoming a prominent league player.

FOOTBALL PREVIEW

Perth impress



South Fremantle will attempt to shake off the lethargy they displayed in the Red Rooster carnival as they strive to maintain their good home-ground record when they clash with Perth.

South showed last season that they are an entirely different proposition on Fremantle Oval when they were able to score convincing wins in every home match.

However, at the back of many people's minds will be the decisive nine goal win Perth meted out to the Bulldogs in the Red Rooster carnival.

If the Demons can reproduce that form then this match promises to be an absorbing encounter.

South, having played off in the past three grand finals, appear to be well-equipped again this season and it may be advisable to forget their pre-season form.

Tigers can atone



Last year's premiers, Claremont, will not only be after their 15th successive league win when they meet East Perth at Claremont Oval, but will be anxious to preserve their unbeaten run at home.

They showed last season that they are a difficult combination to beat at Claremont Oval and though East Perth have been very competitive opponents for them, the Tigers appear to have the odds in their favour.

The Tigers have shown in pre-season form that they will again be an influential team in the competition this year.

East Perth, however, are difficult to gauge on their form in the lead-up to the season.

They looked a very competent combination in pre-season scratch matches but were unable to maintain that form in the Red Rooster carnival.

Top billing

It's not often that two teams who finished out of the four the previous season take top billing in the opening round of a new year.

But that's the situation with the Subiaco-West Perth clash at Subiaco Oval.

The Lions captured football attention last year with their strong showing and are expected to be a challenger for a final four spot this season.

However, West Perth's win in the Red Rooster carnival last weekend indicates that they may make a resurgence in WA football this season.

The feature of their play in the carnival was their mobility on the ball, a factor that let them down in the latter half of the past two seasons.

The Falcons certainly don't lack talent and if new coach Dennis Cometti can fuse it together — and present indications are that he has gone a long way to achieving that goal — they will be a very competitive team this season.



An added feature of this match is the close encounters they have had over the past two seasons.

Subiaco have undergone a strenuous pre-season build-up and on their home ground would have been expected to win this match, before the lightning carnival.

However, West Perth's handling of the Subiaco surface last weekend indicates that they may have the early season form to sneak home in this clash.

Swans set to fire

Bassendean Oval has not been a happy hunting ground for East Fremantle in recent seasons, but the acquisition of Ron Alexander and the loss of several key Swan Districts players makes this an interesting match.


Swans will miss the services of star full forward Simon Beasley and top utility player Gerard Neesham. Leon Baker, who made a big contribution to Swans towards the end of last season, is another significant loss.

On the credit side, however, is the return to football of courageous rover Ed Blackaby.

Alexander has shown he could wield a big influence on the competition this season, but if Old Easts are to make an impact on the competition they will need to put up a strong showing against WA's most successful qualifying-round team over the past two seasons.

Swans have relied heavily on their ability to move the ball forward in an organised pattern since they became a dominant side in the competition in the last round of the 1979 season. It will be interesting to see if the player drain this season will erode that aspect of their game.

WELCOME back to another great season of football . . . and what a season it promises to be!

After a tremendous build-up to the season with good interstate performances by WA club sides and a successful Red Rooster round-robin carnival last weekend, everything is set for a boom season.

Sponsorship — and all the prize money that is associated with the game — has increased yet again.

These are some of the major activities planned for 1982:

- Three interstate clashes — two against South Australia and one against Victoria. WA will play South Australia in Adelaide on June 12 and again at Subiaco Oval on July 17. Just four days before that match — on Tuesday, July 13 — WA will play Victoria at Subiaco Oval. What a feast of football — two interstate matches in four days!
- The \$25,000 Channel 7-Sandover Medal is on again and this year we see the champion South Fremantle ruckman Stephen Michael chasing his third consecutive medal after great victories in 1980 and 1981 — which saw him poll a record 37 votes.
- Marlboro and Town and Country Building Society are, once again, our major WAFL sponsors, each injecting \$72,000 in cash and backing it up with plenty of other promotions to boost our game of football.

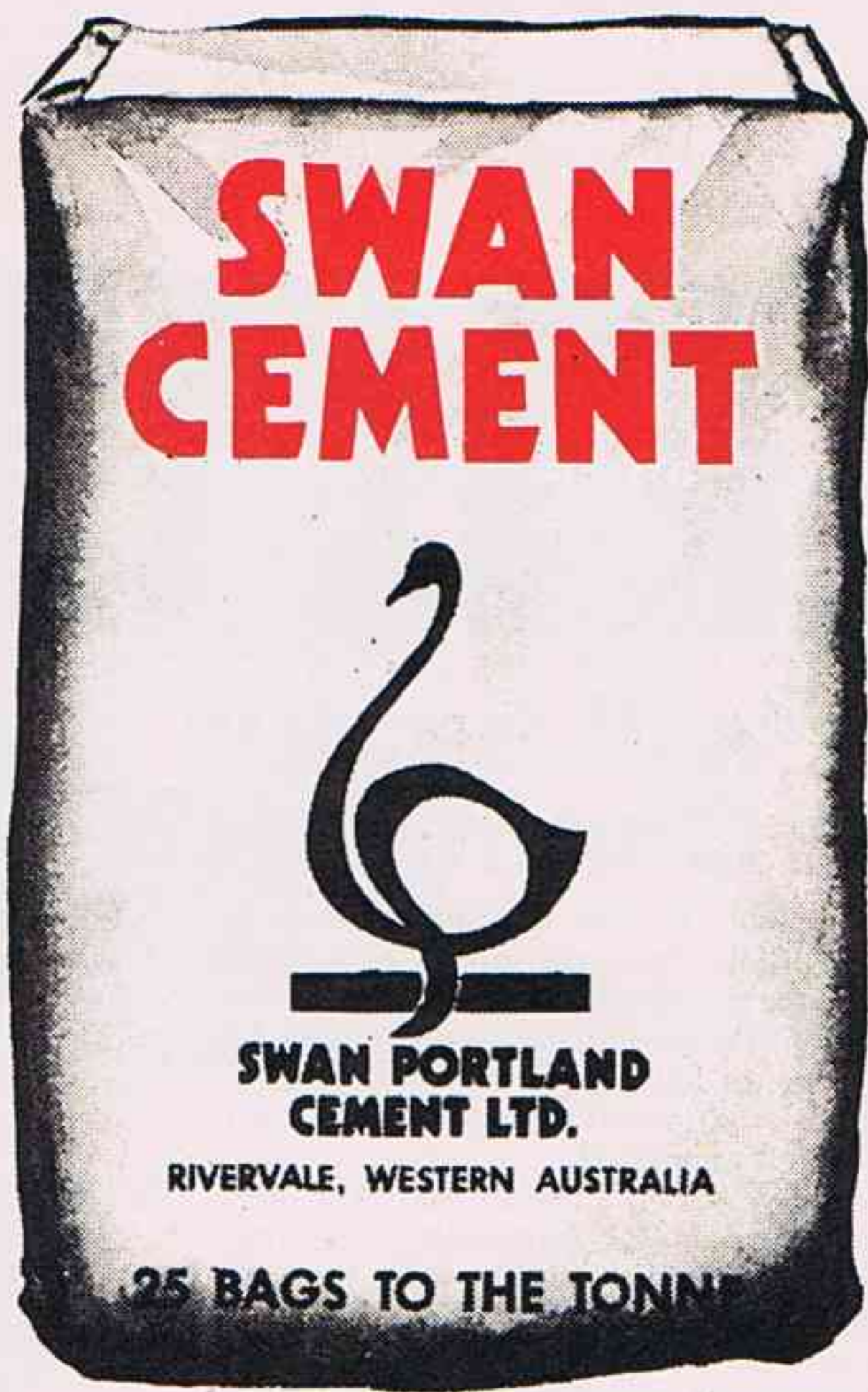

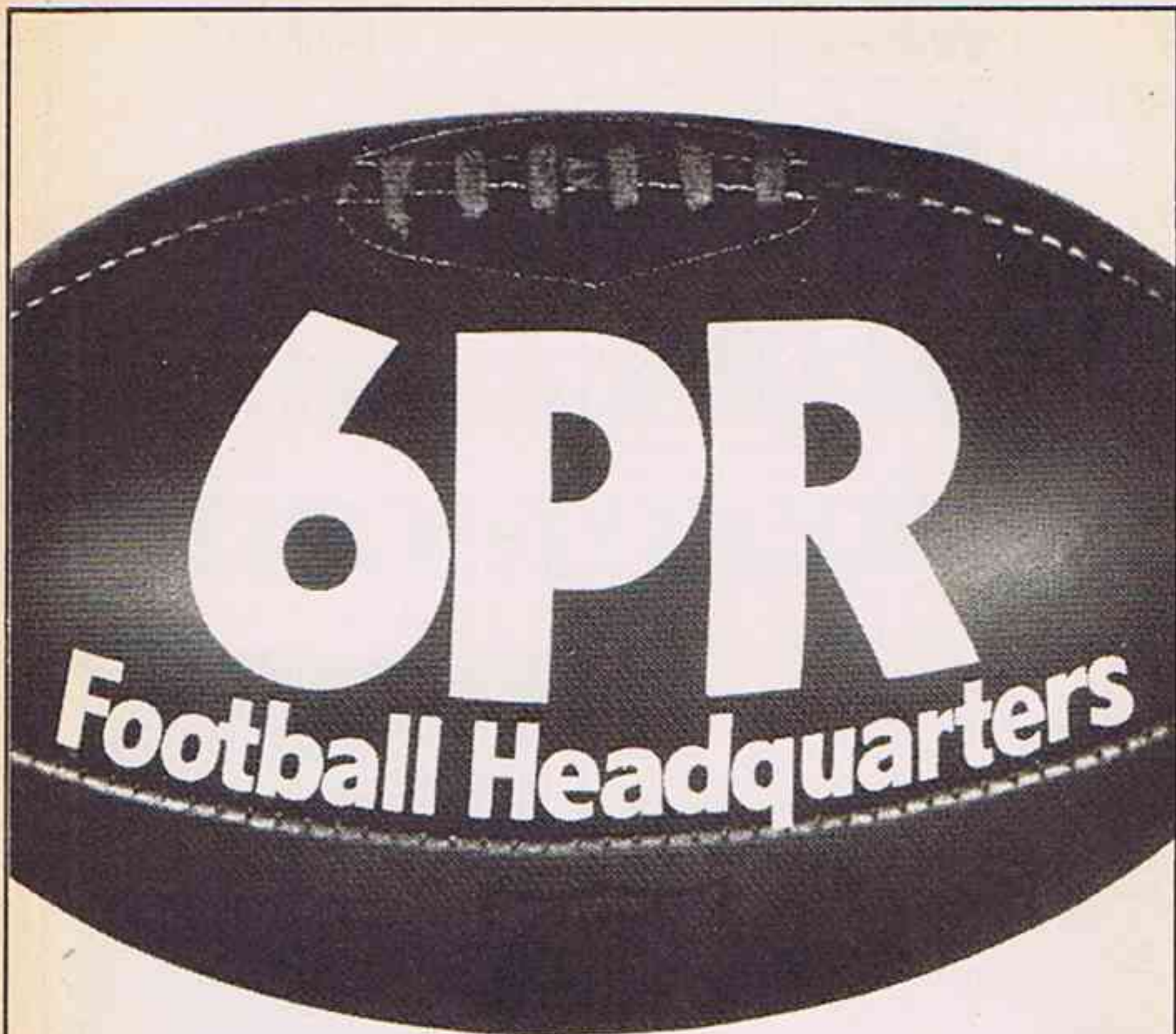

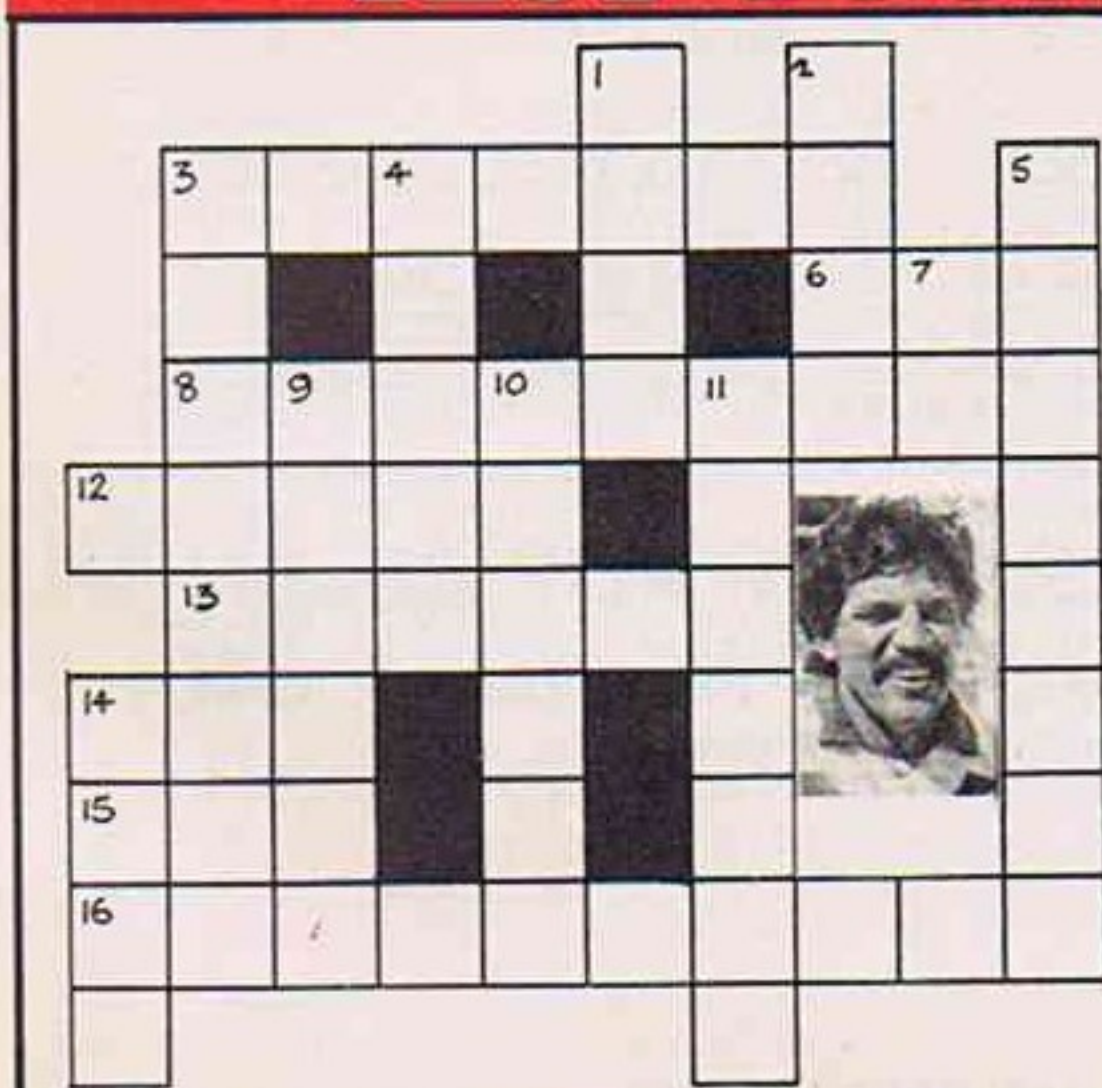
Mystery Player

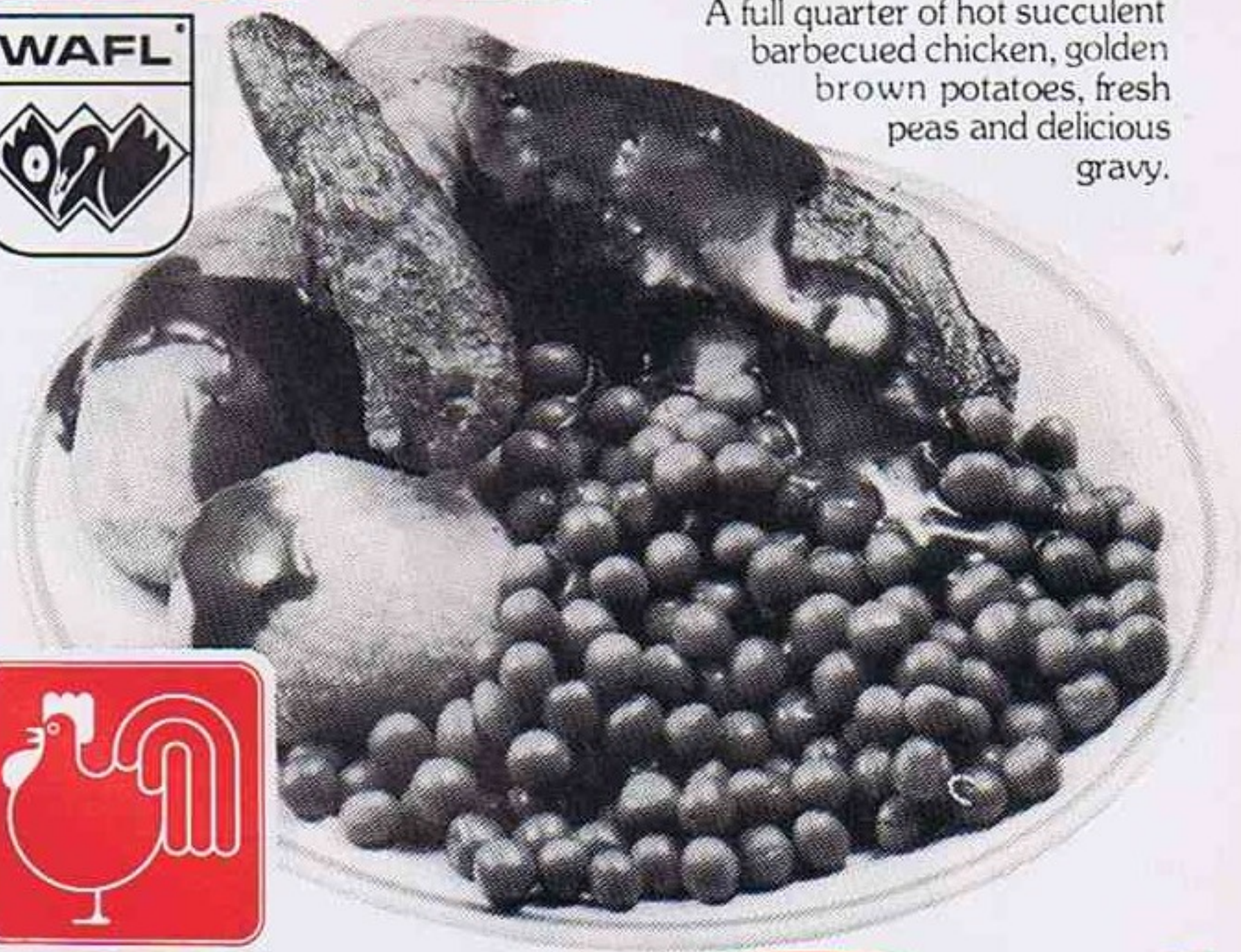
