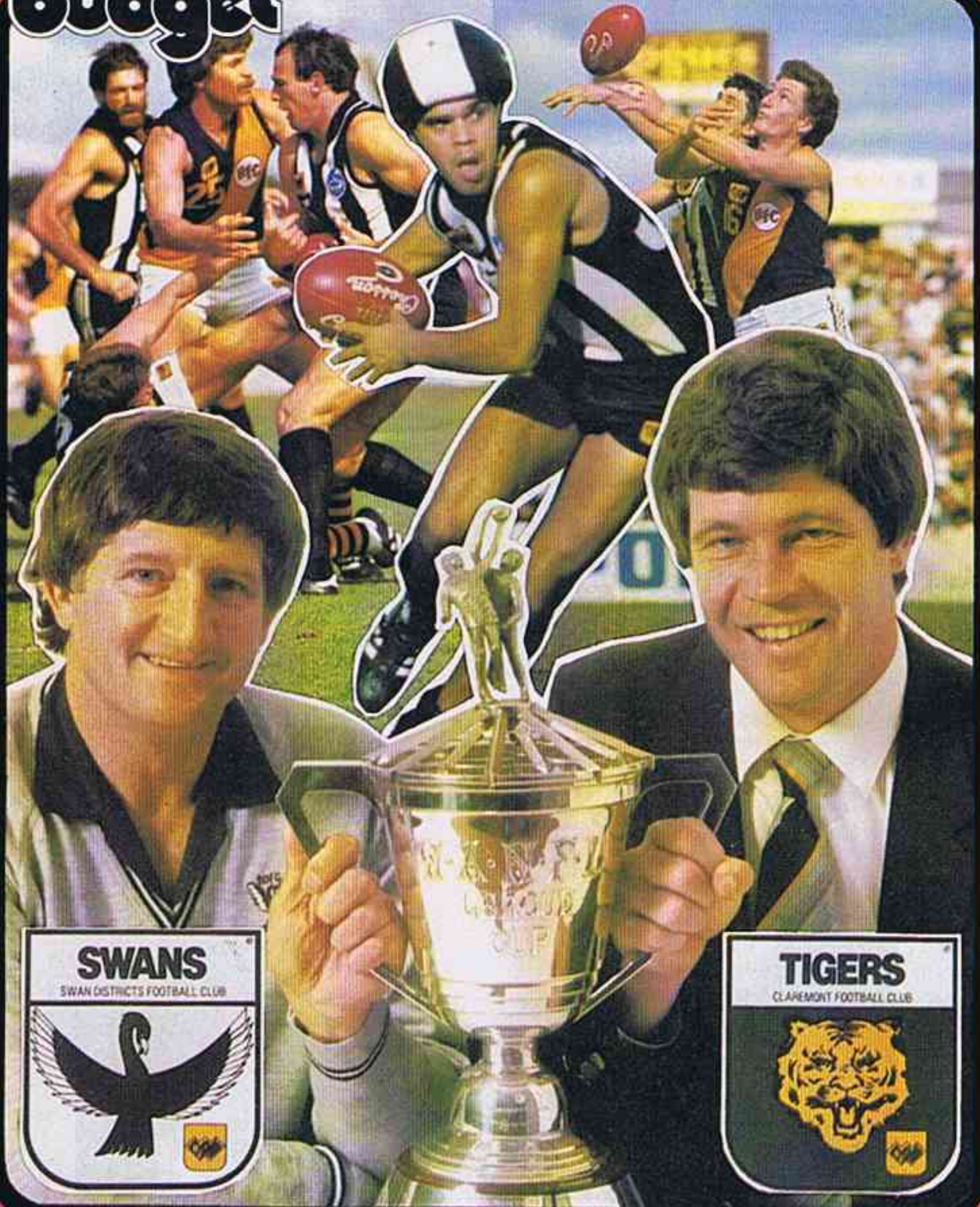

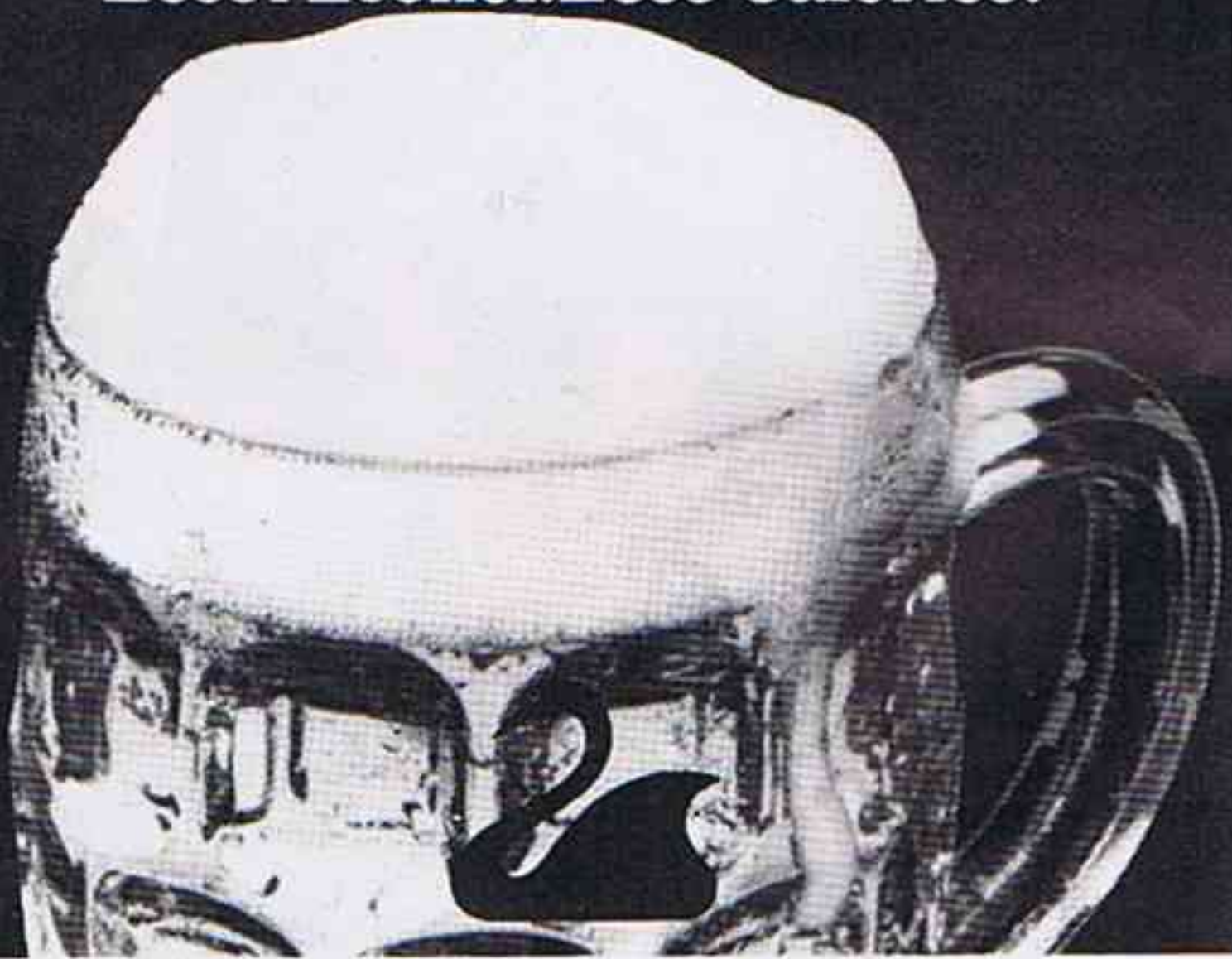

# WHAT A MARK!



IT has been a great year for high marks and this one taken by star Claremont full forward Warren Ralph rivals any pictured this season.

The mark and picture rivals the historic mark by mercurial South Fremantle aerialist John Gerovich in the 1956 preliminary final and East Fremantle's Kevin Taylor and Claremont's Brett Farmer this year.

Each was spectacular and probably the only mark to match them in recent years was the one by West Perth's Corry Bewick in 1980.

A feature of Ralph's mark was the way he was able to fly over Ray Holden and take it on his chest.

It is already being compared with Gerovich's as the best picture of a mark in a final round match since the last war.

However, Gerovich took his mark over rover-size Ray French, while Ralph towered over the biggest full-back in the competition. Holden is 190 centimetres tall.

The mark has culminated an outstanding season for Ralph. He topped the goalkicking ladder for the second successive year with more than 100 goals.

A feature of his play has been his high marking and that poses problems for Swan Districts today.

But in Claremont's two final round matches, Aitken has been their most consistent player this season.

In the Tigers' losing effort against Swan Districts it was Aitken who tried desperately to get them back into the game. He refused to give in without a fight and he held the defence together.

And on Saturday it was again Aitken, through the desperate way he approached the game, who set the example for his team-mates.

The 22-year-old medical student is always prepared to work hard at ground level and do the things which win final-round football.

He could not be happier as he prepares himself for the grand final and will no doubt be looking to continue with his impressive form.

He started on a half-back flank against West Perth in last week's preliminary final and the Falcons forwards had to earn every kick they gained when playing on the talented Aitken.

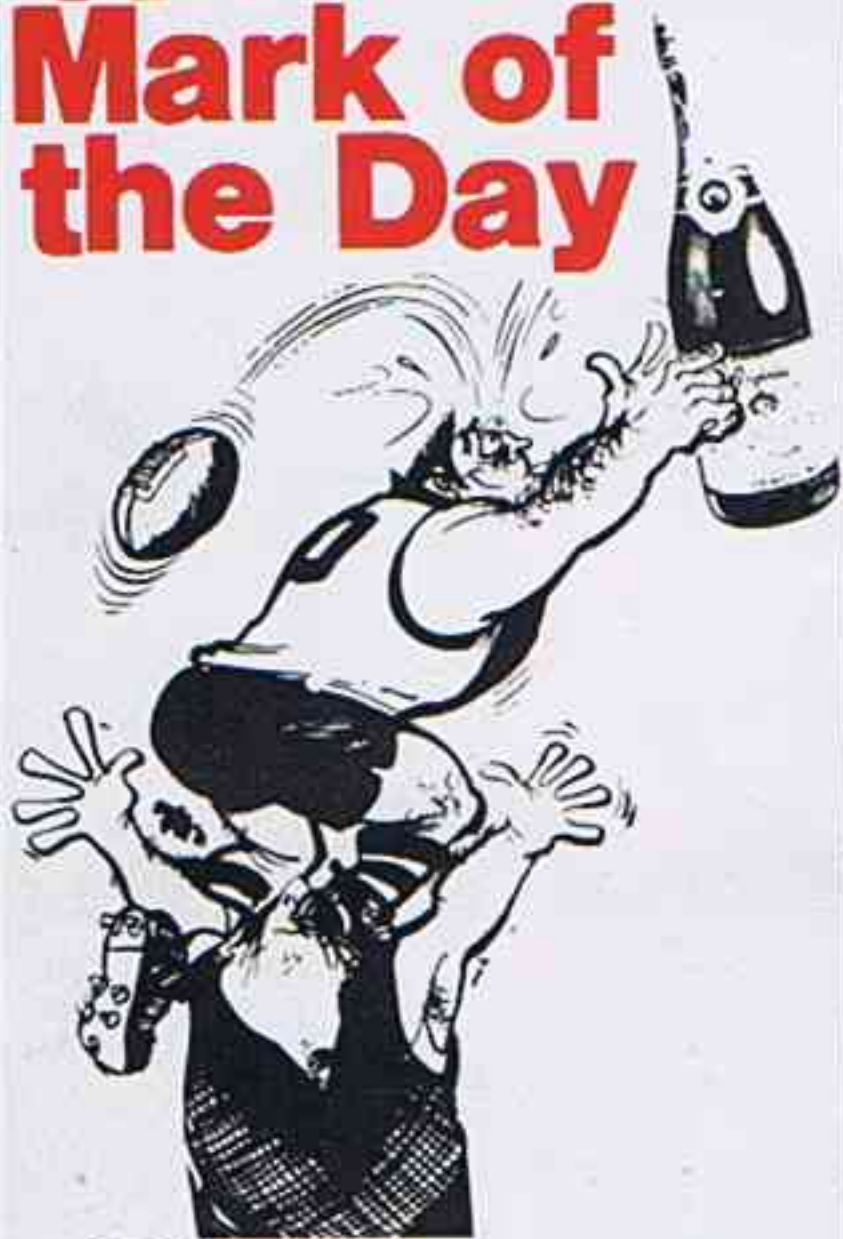

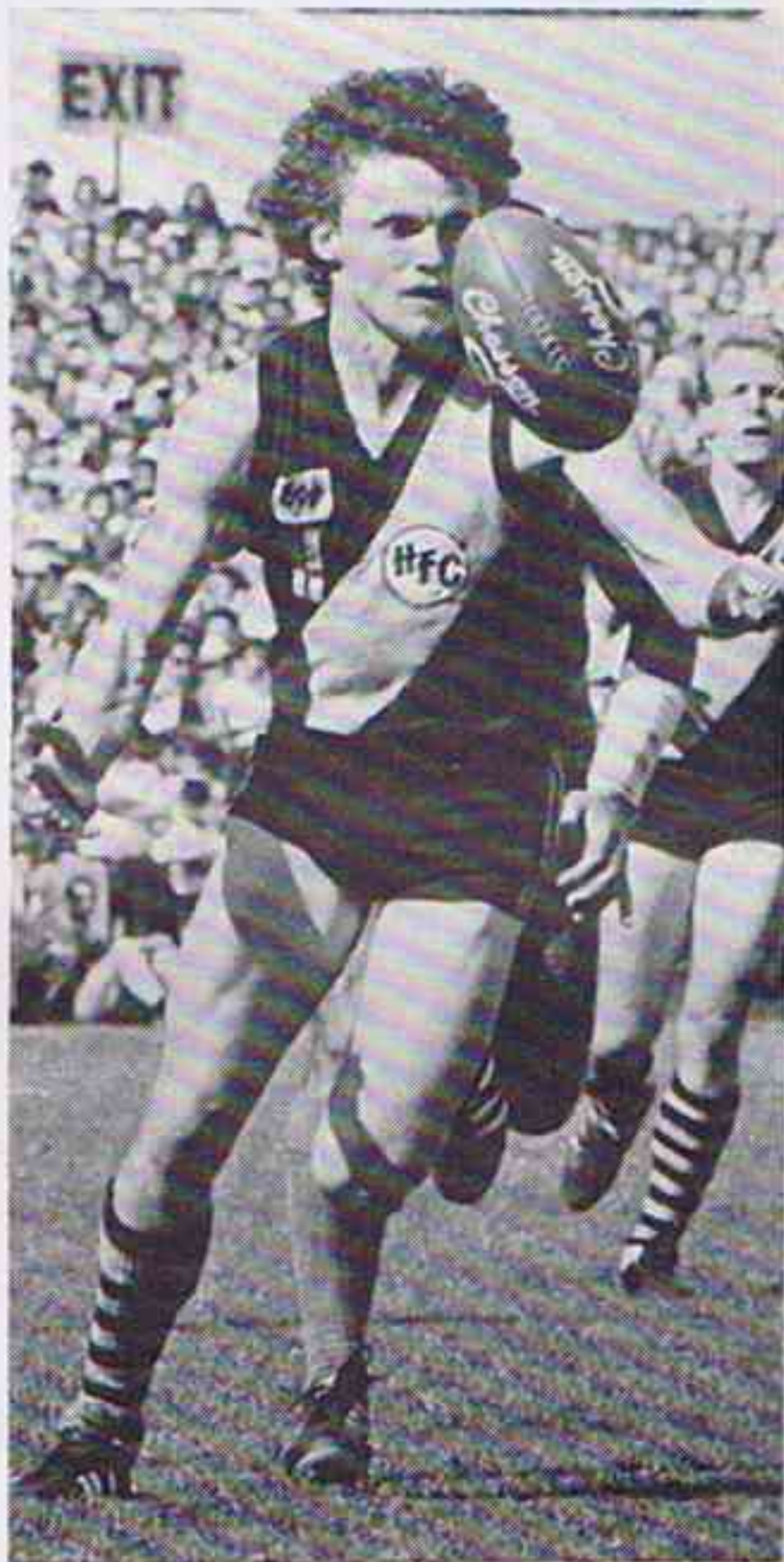
# The Big Game

CLAREMONT and Swan Districts will create history today. It will be their first clash in a grand final.

Since joining the WAFL in 1926 and 1934 respectively, both clubs have had only limited success.

Claremont will be playing in only their 10th grand final while Swans will appear in a grand final for only the sixth time.

Both sides accumulated most of their premierships in purple patches. The Tigers won three of their five from 1938-40.

Their other wins were in 1964 and last year.

Swans won their three in succession between 1961 and 1963.

Ironically, between 1961 and 1965 Swans played in four grand finals but the only year they missed out, Claremont played.

It will be very much a contrast in styles when they meet today.

Claremont are acknowledged as a very skilful side, while Swans have developed an aggressive and flexible team.

It will be Swans third attempt to win a grand final since they were last successful.

Since their golden years they have performed poorly in finals, having won only four of the 12 they have been in.

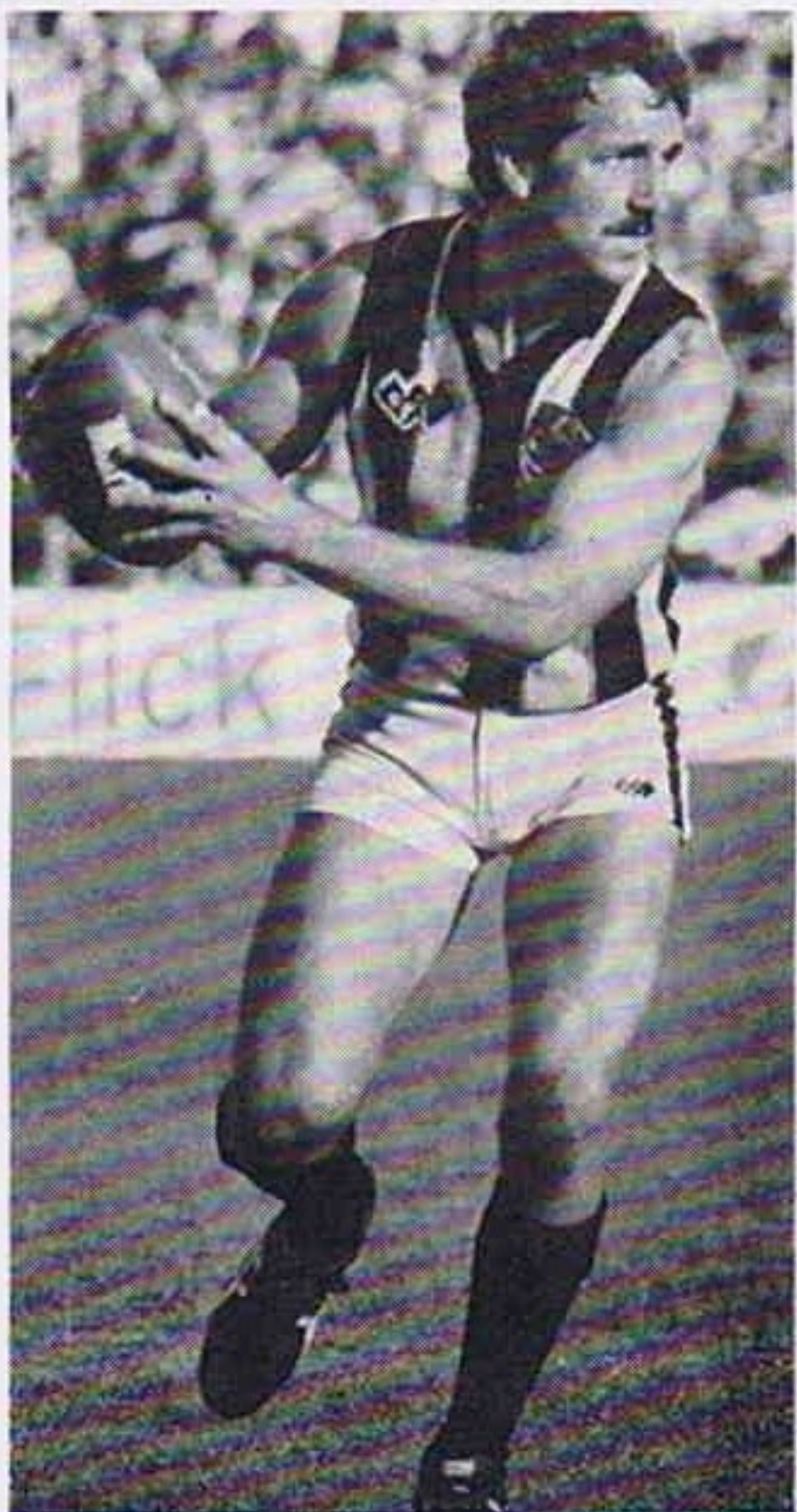
Until last year Claremont also had difficulty winning finals matches, having won only one out of nine between premiership years.

But the way they won last year's premiership and the confident way they have played this season indicates, despite having been beaten in the second semi-final by Swans, that they have the confidence and assurance needed to win a grand final.


Swans deserve a premiership, having won 55 out of 68 qualifying games since becoming a force in the last round of 1979.

It will be interesting to see whether aggression and determination are enough to counter a side endowed with skilled players.

That is what makes this grand final one of the most interesting in recent years.

The major award is for the player, who by his performance sets the best example, through his skill, temperament and attitude, both on and off the field.

He will receive a gold replica of the Media Guild badge, valued at more than \$1000.

The other award is for the player considered to be a star of the future. While it is designed to go to a young star he does not have to be a first year player.

WA's most experienced football writer, Geoff Christian, has already won another Media Guild award. He collected a \$500 wardrobe from John Buzza for selecting the most winners during the qualifying rounds.

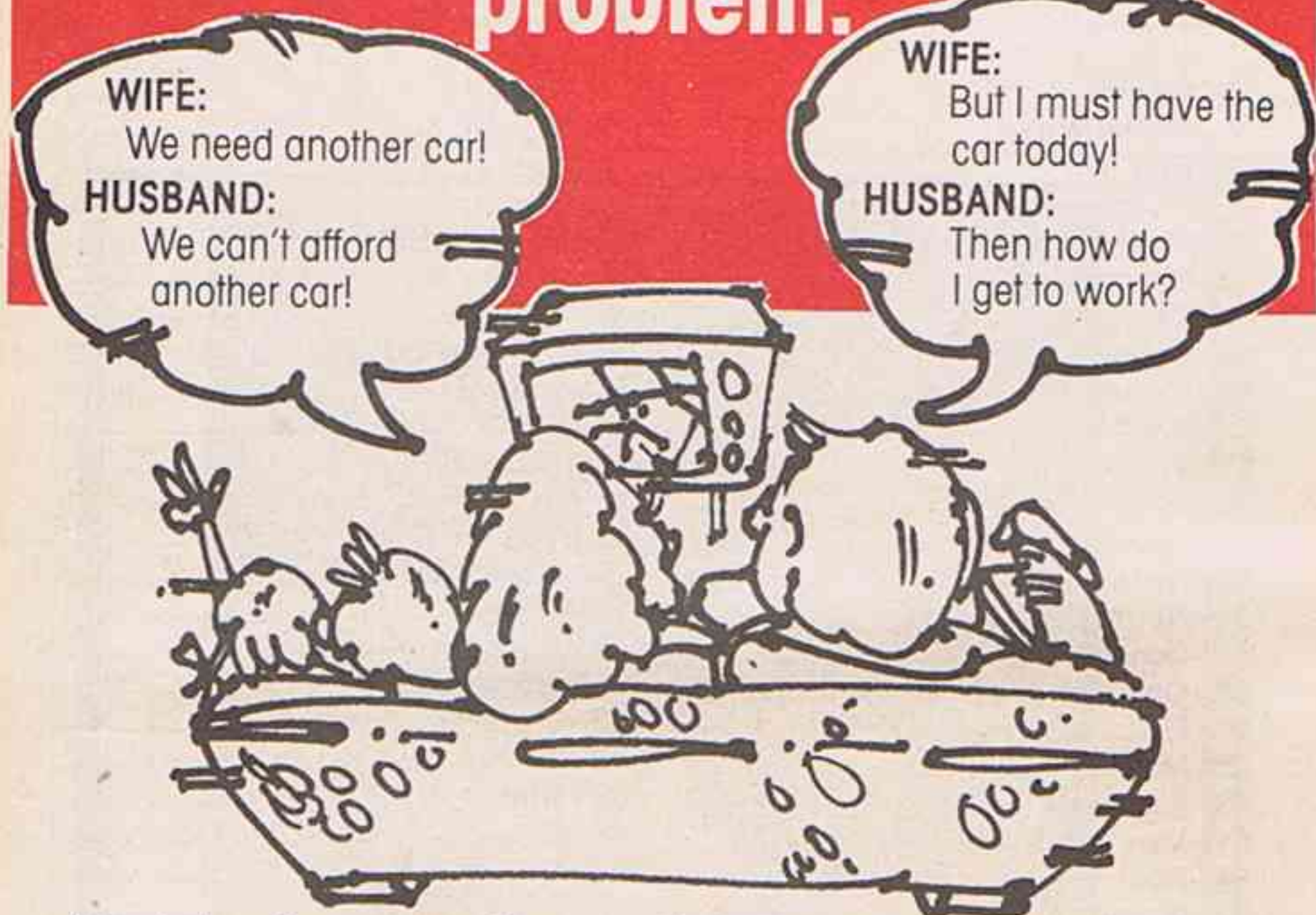

Though they are two of the most experienced men in league football, rival coaches Graham Moss and John Todd are relative rookies to grand finals . . . even though both have coached a premierships side.

It will be the second grand final for Moss as a coach and the third in which he has been involved. Moss played in his first league grand final in 1972 when the Tigers, after losing only two games all season, were unable to handle East Perth.

Last year was the second grand final in which he has played and his first as a coach.

He will be easily Claremont's most experienced player today, and along with Swans captain Graham Melrose, is one of the elite band of players who have reached 300 league games.

Moss was an important cog in a five year plan by Claremont to win a premiership. Though his first season back with the club in 1977 had a poor result, the Tigers have been an influential side in the competition since then.

While Todd has not often had the taste of grand final football as a coach, he is one of the most experienced coaches in Australia. He is in his 10th successive year as a league coach.

He had a tough initiation with Swans as they finished last in his first two years with them. However, in 1979 they started to find the form that has made them such an influential side in the past three years, when they finished fifth.

Since then they have reached the grand final twice and finished third on the other occasion.

Today Todd will be trying to achieve with Swans what only one other person has done.

Haydn Bunton junior, who has helped Swans with their grand final preparation, coached them to their only three premierships.

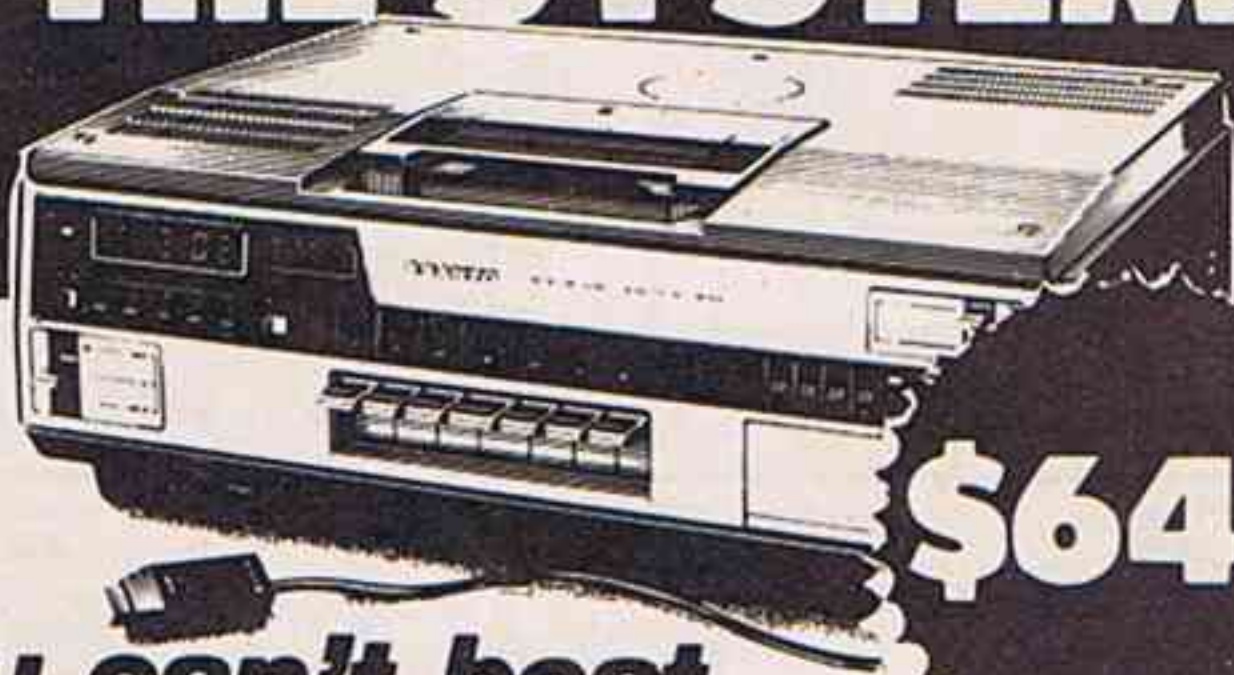

# LEAGUE VIEWPOINT

## **POLICY ON SPONSORSHIP**

The West Australian Football League has asked the State Government to give consideration to allowing a small proportion of excess TAB profits to be channelled into other sporting organisations including Australian football.

This step was taken because we desperately need additional financial support to be able to provide and maintain acceptable public facilities and a highly competitive competition and to develop the game at all levels.

What we do not need, particularly at this time, is any action or proposal which would take away a major part of the revenue we already have.

Yet this is the intended effect of a resolution passed recently by a major political party in this State. It is also the intended effect of a statement made by a prominent sporting administrator: "to ban sponsorship of sport by tobacco companies."

The Marlboro Company has been a major sponsor of League Football in this State since 1975. The League values highly the generous assistance Marlboro has provided.

The League cannot afford to lose sponsors of this calibre, nor, we suspect, can other prominent sporting organisations in Western Australia.

The WAFL supports a declaration passed by a national gathering of sport administrators in 1979:

"That sporting bodies have the sole right to accept or reject sponsorship without

prejudicing their rights for funding controlled by Government".

In other words, no individual, organisation or government should be able to tell a sporting organisation from whom it may or may not accept sponsorship. Public opinion polls indicate that most people agree that sporting groups should be free to accept money from cigarette manufacturers.

No one believes that business firms are prepared to give money to sport and expect nothing in return. They regard sponsorship as good public relations. The name of the company is put before the public in a favourable context, and the organisation is seen to be performing a service to the community.

It is important for us all to understand the danger underlying proposals to ban sponsorship by one or other product manufacturer. If we let it happen, we are giving up our freedom, the right to decide things for ourselves.

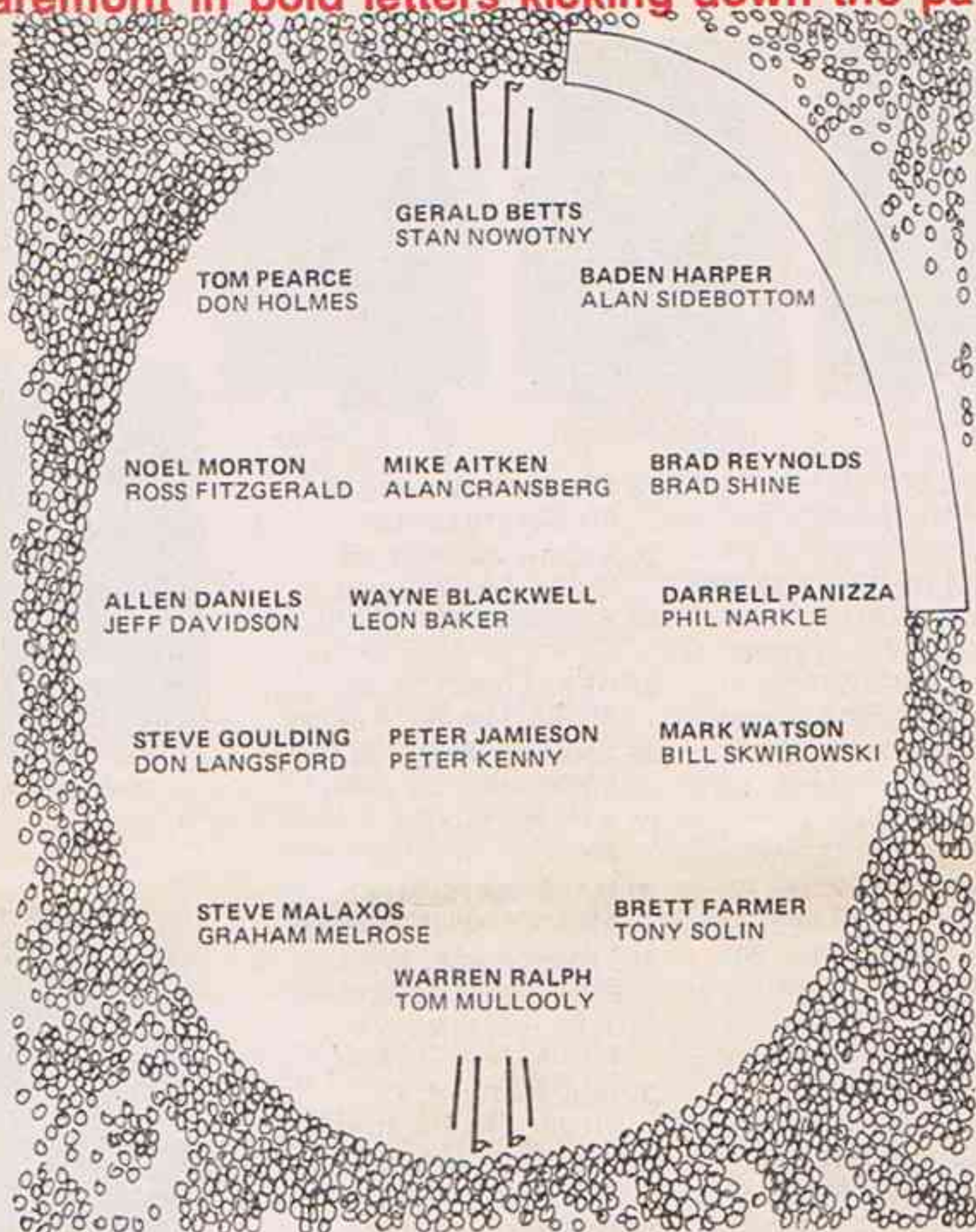

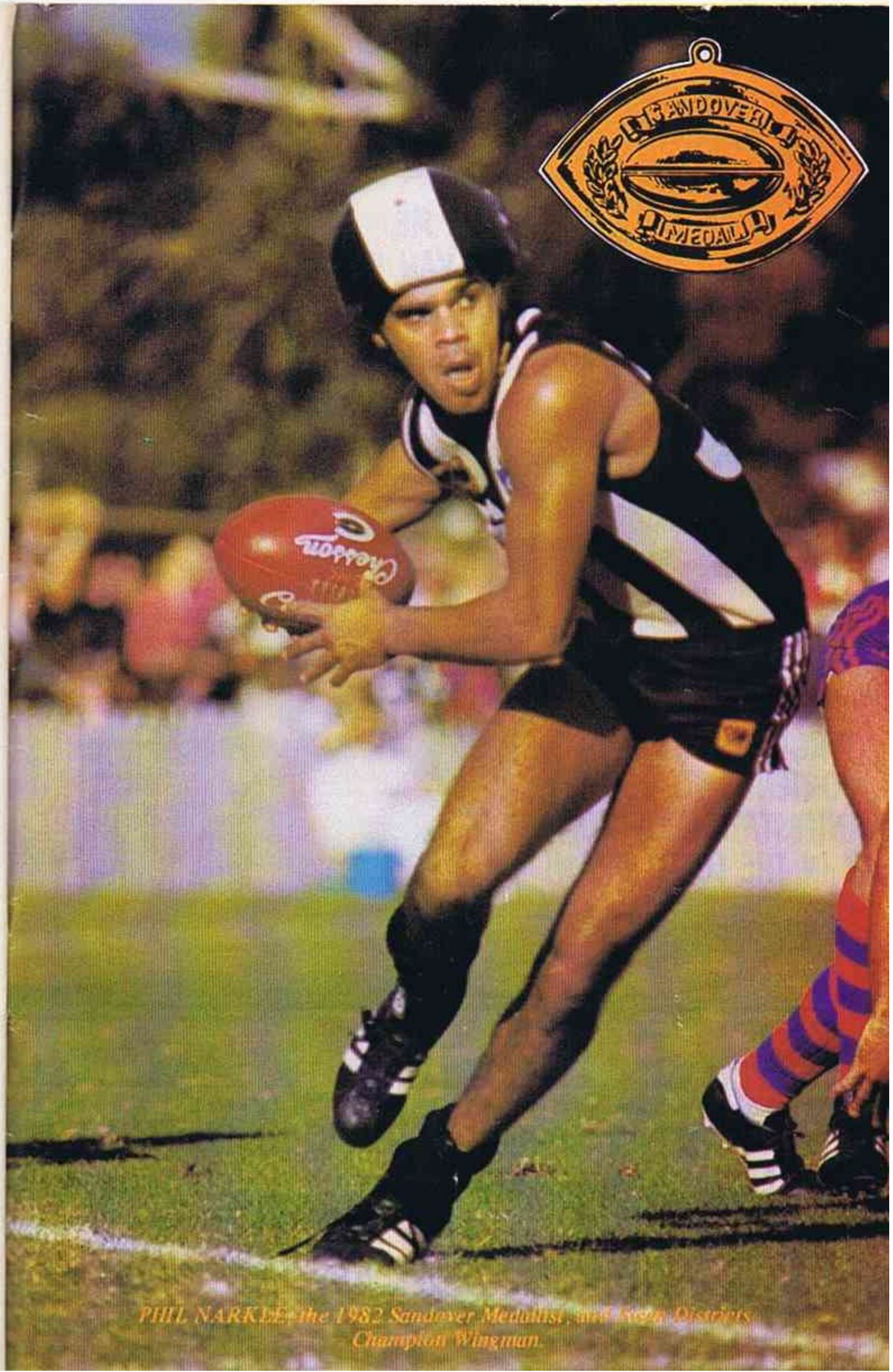
